Driver Reminders

Please contact the office

It's really important that drivers contact the office immediately if there is any issue with the delivery of meals - for example if we have made a mistake with packing the meals or especially if the person is not answering the door when you arrive.

Please do not wait until you get back to the office to let us know - this is why we require everyone to have a mobile phone on hand while doing deliveries. We have spares at the office so please ask for one if required.

If someone's health may be at risk, we have a duty of care to respond immediately. Thank You.

Name Tags & Lanyards (and car magnets)

It is important that our drivers are identified as part of our Meals on Wheels Volunteer family for the reassurance and safety of our customers and their families. Clients & families often enquire if our drivers wear a visible ID while delivering meals. The fact that we do is part of our overall quality and safety program.

Clients do have the right to refuse your entry if they are fearful of their safety in any way.

A reminder to please remember to leave your lanyard in the basket at the end of your delivery.

Some people are keeping them in their cars for "next time" which sometimes means we do not have enough lanyards for all our drivers. The same applies for the car magnets which some people seem to be keeping on their vehicles. These items do tend to get lost if they are not stored here.

SCAMS - Beware!

There is such a variety of scams out there and the nasty perpetrators are getting better and better at what they do.

Please note that these situations are very common and you NEED TO TELL SOMEONE if you think you have fallen victim to one of these scams.

Please do not be embarrassed or ashamed or feel silly - it is **NOT your fault.** People of all ages and backgrounds have been tricked into parting with their personal information or money - these pests do not discriminate. And they **do not care.**

Here's the blunt truth:

- I. If you do not like whoever is on the other end of a phone call, HANG UP!
- 2. You do not have to be polite! You owe them nothing including courtesy.
- 3. If you are suspicious about the call or if the person on the phone is evasive in any way HANG
- 4. If they start the conversation asking you to identify yourself, you have the right to ask them to verify THEIR identity first.
- 5. Most of the big companies you are likely to deal with are getting used to their customers being wary of telephone contact due to concerns about scamming.
- 6. Most of these companies are opting to post letters for any formal correspondence.
- 7. If you use email, the same thing applies. In fact you probably need to be more careful with clicking on links in emails. They are so cleverly disguised as a legitimate email. Once again, you can contact the company yourself to query this. Make sure you use a contact number you have for them on existing invoices or documentation, rather than a number provided in the suspicious email.
- 8. And finally, just to reiterate PLEASE TELL SOMEONE! Call a family member, a trusted friend, or neighbour immediately if your gut instinct is telling you that something is a little bit fishy! The sooner you act, the better the outcome might be for you and for others who may fall victim to the same trickery.

From the President

More than just a meal.

A neat slogan that captures the important difference between Meals on Wheels services and those offered by "drop and go" commercial operations.

You and I know it instinctively because it's one of the reasons we volunteer to deliver meals to vulnerable members of our community. Having a chat and conducting a welfare check are part and parcel of what we do.

So, I found it encouraging to hear a senior bureaucrat from the Commonwealth Health Department confirm this at a Senate estimates committee hearing recently. He said, in part, we are trying to find a way to help Meals on Wheels thrive [with] its volunteer base and that important social interaction; to preserve it going forward. We don't want a traditional Meals on Wheels service replaced by mere meals delivery.

The Senate estimates committee was probing the Department about a project called 'Future Fit'.

The project, involving a number of frontline Meals on Wheels services, is endeavouring to establish the cost base for these services Australia-wide. It's not a trivial exercise as there are wide variations between the states in how services are run and supported. The

hope is that Future Fit will provide solid data on which future funding can be based, in time for implementation of the new Aged Care Act in 2025.
